- Once Gomer arrived at the Rimshaw place, did he approach this situation differently from Barney and the boys?
- When Andy accompanied Barney and Gomer into the house, where were Barney and Gomer walking?
- What was your opinion of the quality of Barney and Gomer's investigation into the cellar?
- Toward the end of the episode, do you believe Andy was truly afraid, or only pretending?
- Do you see similarities between the way Barney, Gomer, Opie, and his friend handled fear, and the way we sometimes deal with fear?
- Why does fear exist? Is fear ever helpful?
- Can you recall scriptural examples where someone was struggling to deal with fear?
- What does our heavenly Father tell us about fear? What does He want us to know?
